This beautiful complex will boast 55 studios, 111 one-bedroom, and 35 twobedroom luxury apartments. It will also provide 205 spaces in its parking garage along with a retail cafe, clubroom, concierge and rooftop terrace, along with other luxury amenities.

Lynbrook firefighters sponded to the scene of an auto accident and overturn at the corner of Ocean and Merton avenues on June 11.

One of the vehicles involved in the crash overturned and landed on its roof on the front lawn of a residence on Ocean Avenue. The second car in the accident had minor damage.

Firefighters, from the Truck and Tally-Ho companies tended declined medical help. to the driver of the overturned ve-

hicle with the help of members of the department's Emergency Medical Company under the command of Chief Chris Kelly. The driver was placed on a stretcher and transported to a local hospital by Lynbrook's Emergency Medical Company ambulance.
